#### 1.0 Introduction

This document is meant to briefly summarize the history of the Boy Scouts of America Troop 465 from 1963 to 2018. The troop was founded in June, 1963 by the Hickory Flat Elementary School Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) with five scouts, John W. Ballard, Buddy J. Callahan, Myron G. Croft, George W. McClure, and David J. Sisson, and seven adult leaders, SM James R. Johnson, SA David Callahan, EO/CC Eugene Lawson, CR Raleigh McClure, MC Charlie Mann, MC Carl McGaha, and MC Jack Payne. See Figures 4A and 4B for the 1963 Charter Roster.

Charter member **John Ballard** became an Assistant Scoutmaster when he returned from active Army service. He has been with the troop since day one and is a wealth of information, skills, and a most valued asset to the troop. The annual re-chartering rosters were used to list the number of scouts and adults and their highest ranks and positions.

We know this is not a fully accurate accounting, since every year there are several boys who join on school night and for some reason do not stay until the next re-charter, then do not show up on any list. This is also true for ranks. A scout attains a rank and it shows up on the re-charter. He may attain additional rank(s) but then drops out. Also note for the years 2006, 2007, 2008, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, the rosters did not list the scout ranks, so some ranks may be listed incorrectly in this listing in section 17.

Note ('yr) example ('73) after a name denotes year the scout became a Troop 465 Eagle Scout.

#### 1.1 Troop 465 Highlights

The following are just a few of the Troop 465 Highlights.

- **John Ballard**, a charter Scout member, and an Assistant Scoutmaster has been with the Troop for the entire history to date.
- 98 Scouts have been awarded the Rank of Eagle. This number represents 15.01% of Scouts ever registered with the troop, well above the national average of 5%.
- 11 lives have been documented as having been saved by Troop members.
- Scout Clay Limbaugh ('91) became the first to be an Assistant Scoutmaster, then Scoutmaster.
- 91 have participated as Assistant Scoutmasters, of which 51 who were former Scouts in the troop and 11 of the 51 are still active in the troop today.
- 163 local residents have participated as Committee Members.
- Registered Adult participation with Troop 465 totals over 1,379 years!
- It should be mentioned, ours was the second Troop 465. It was first chartered to Antioch Christian Church in the late 1950's. Big Springs Church then chartered an Explorer Post and many older members of the Troop left 465 and joined Post 601. The church carried the charter to Hickory Flat School PTA. HFS finally found a Scoutmaster, Bob Johnson, enough adults to form a committee, and re-chartered Troop 465 in 1963. To my knowledge no former Antioch members joined Hickory Flat 465.

#### 2.0 Sponsoring Institutions

The troop was chartered, in June 1963, to the Hickory Flat Elementary School Parent-Teachers Association. Mr. George Lingefelt was the Chairman of the Hickory Flay School Trustees, Hickory Flat School is on the northwest corner of the intersection at East Cherokee Drive and Hickory Road. The Troop was not the original Troop 465 which was chartered by the Antioch Christion Church which had disbanded before our Troop was formed. See Figure 2A for a photo of Hickory Flat Elementary School.

In 1985 the charter was transferred to the Hickory Flat United Methodist Church Men's club. The Hickory Flat United Methodist Church was located across from Hickory Flat Elementary School, where the Hickory Flat Library now stands. (See Figure 2B for a photo Hickory Flat United Methodist Church). In 1992 the church moved two miles north on East Cherokee Drive.

In 1997, 465 Alumni, Inc., also known as Friends of Troop 465, a non-profit organization, was created with the express mission of providing support and sponsorship specifically for Troop 465. The Alumni chartered the troop and provided a home at 5742 East Cherokee Drive, hopefully in perpetuity. The compound is called the George and Nora Lingefelt Scouting Center. (See Table 2 for a list of sponsors and meeting places).

A partial listing of the philosophies as written in The Scoutmasters Handbook as listed above includes:

- 2. A Scoutmaster controls, but does not command. He calls the signals but is rarely up front. A Scoutmaster is more like a coach than a commander. His work is done before the action takes place. A good Scoutmaster works himself into the background and the boy leaders into the foreground. He spends more time training boys than doing their work.
- 3. A Scoutmaster's goal should be training future leaders by giving the opportunity to lead, then molding and guiding that leadership.

#### History

The Chartered Organization, plays a very important role in any Scout troop. The CO is granted a charter by the Boy Scouts of America and "owns" the troop. The troop sponsor approves and selects the troop committee, the Scoutmaster, assistant Scoutmasters, and all troop leaders. One can see if there was ever a divide between the troop sponsor and its Scout troop, it could spell disaster.

In 1996, Troop 465 avoided such a disaster by the forming of 465 Alumni, Inc. Prior to this time, it had been the dream of many "alumni" of Troop 465 to be associated with a troop sponsor that fully understood its history and philosophies.

On December 3, 1996, through the efforts of attorney **Jim Turner** ('73) and the Board of Directors, 465 Alumni, Inc. was created as a non-profit corporation. The mission statement formed by the charter members of 465 Alumni, Inc. specifically identifies the methods that **George Lingefelt** employed during his 35 years as Scoutmaster of Troop 465.

Big Springs United Methodist Church donated a building to the troop and we moved it onto three acres once occupied by the original Avery Elementary School. This site is now owned by 465 Alumni, Inc. This building, the **George and Nora Lingefelt Scouting Center**, serves as the scout hut for Troop 465. Many friends of the Troop have participated in bringing the Scout hut and grounds to their present condition. To ensure the Troop 465 legacy continues, please download and complete a 465 Alumni Inc. Membership Application.

In 2009, 465 Alumni, Inc. became classified as a 501(c)3. Due to that classification, 465 Alumni, Inc. can now accept tax deductible donations.

#### 3.0 Meeting Places/ Scout Huts

During the Troop's lifetime, it has had 5 different, regular, meeting places. The Troop first held meetings at the Hickory Flat Elementary School cafeteria from 1963 until 1985, with the exception of a short period of 1969 when the Troop met at a building behind the house at 6649 Vaughn road. In 1985 the Troop moved to what was known as the Hickory Flat Courthouse, from its use as a voting precinct. It was formerly a small, two room feed store located on the northeast corner of the intersection of East Cherokee Drive and State Highway 140. In June of 1990 the Troop, for reasons of better parking and Scout safety, moved to the Union Hill Community Center, formerly the Union Hill School (1925 to 1958), located on A. J. Land road.

In 1997, through the generous and exhaustive effort of current and past members, parents, grandparents, and friends of the Troop, 465 Alumni, Inc. was able to procure 3 acres, formerly the old Avery School site. A building was donated by Big Springs Methodist Church and moved on-site. The basement was dug by Assistant Scoutmaster **Jack Mitchell** (Troop 465 Eagle Scout '73) and the foundation laid underneath. Scout father, **David Butler**, donated supplies and labor crews to build the basement walls, a front deck, a rear staircase, and three sidewalks.

Upon completion of the remodeling in 1998 the Troop began meeting at the **George and Nora Lingefelt** Scouting Center located at 5742 East Cherokee Road. The facility, on over 3 acres, is occupied by the **Hans Priegel** pavilion, picnic tables, storage buildings, parking, **Dobson** Family Campground, **John Ballard** Campfire Ring, a 50' rifle range, and the Eagle Walk flag pole plaza.




Figure 3.5.G George and Nora Lingefelt Scouting Center, John Ballard Campfire Ring

The plaza was designed by **John Ballard** (see Figure 3.5.F) for the original design drawing). After the concrete footing was laid Jeremy Dobson (Eagle '99) used his skill to lay out the Fleur de Lis. **John Ballard** and two close friends, **Demetrios Pettas** (a brick and stone mason) and **George Petrokopolus** (a restaurant owner) laid all the brick work then installed the engraved Eagle bricks of all the current Eagles, along with all the blank bricks for future Eagles. Neither man accepted any payment. The plaza was named Eagle Walk at the request of **W.J.** (Bill) Jarrard (CC '67) the father of Billy Jarrard ('68), for whom the plaza was dedicated. Bill Jarrard contributed the money pay for the bricks and the flag pole. Jack Mitchell ('73) and John Ballard installed the flag pole.

Figures 3.4.E show Hickory Flat Fire Fighters burning the Old Avery School gym as a training practice. It was reported that the fire quickly spread along the roof line from one end to the other end as a result of residual wax build up from the many years of the gym being lit by candles which were installed on boards in the ceiling.

Now the troop has 29 scouts ages 11 to 17, one scout master, 20 assistant scout master, 51 committee members and six alumni board of directors. 


Figure 3.5.L One of the many flags flown at the Scout Hut




Figure 3.5.M Dedication of the George and Nora Lingefelt Scouting Center

# 5.1. Executive Officers, Institution Head, Committee Chairman and Committee.

The troop has had 22 Executive officers, 14 Institution Heads/Charter Representatives, 29 Committee Chairman's, and 98 Committee members.

#### 5.2. Scoutmasters

There have only been seven Scoutmasters in the troop since its first charter in 1963. The first was **James R. "Bob" Johnson** 

He was followed by **David Callahan** from 1964 through 1966.

In 1967 **George Lingefelt** (see Figure 5.3.C) became the third Scoutmaster for the troop and held the position through 2001. Under **George Lingefelt's** leadership the troop became strong and its reputation grew. **George Lingefelt** received the Silver Beaver Award (see Figure 8) in 1975 and completed Wood Badge in 1994. **George Lingefelt** also was awarded Scoutmaster Emeritus badge,



**Gerald Dobson** became the fourth Scoutmaster of the Troop in 2002 and served through 2008. Scoutmaster **Gerald Dobson** first became involved with Troop 465 when the first of his three sons joined the troop in 1982.

Mike Pellegrino became the fifth Scoutmaster serving through 2012.

In 2013 Mike Lamanac became the sixth Scoutmaster serving through 2015.

In 2016 Ronald Clay Limbaugh, Jr. ('91) became the seventh Scoutmaster. Limbaugh earned his Eagle in 1991 (#27) under George Lingefelt. Scoutmaster Limbaugh is the first 465 Eagle Scout to become the Troop Scoutmaster.




Figure 6.B Trail to Eagle Rank

# **New Eagle Scout honored**

Like father, like son. After years of being prepared, a Hickory Flat youngster achieved the Boy Scouts highest honor.

On Dec. 8 at the Union Hill Community Center, Justin Mitchell became the 35th and newest Eagle Scout of Hickory Flat Boy Scout Troop 465.

An honor in and of itself, Mitchell's achievement is all the more remarkable when one considers that Justin, son of Eagle Scout Jack Mitchell, received the award from both the same troop and the same Scoutmaster as did his father, nearly 24 years ago.

He is the first Scout ever, in the Atlanta Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America, to boast such an accomplishment.

"It was a big relief getting (the award)," said the 18-year old Mitchell, a Canton resident and

senior at Cherokee High School. "It was special to me, and my dad was real proud."

Both Mitchells received their awards from longtime Scoutmaster George Lingefelt, who has been with the troop for 32 of its 34 years in existence.

Mitchell began his quest for the prestigious Eagle Scout award, of which just 2 percent of all Boy Scouts are ever fortunate enough to receive, at the age of 10. He received his first and most memorable honor, that of Scout, shortly thereafter.

Before he could receive the honor of Eagle Scout however, Mitchell had to complete an individual project, followed by an inquiry by the Board of Review to ensure that Mitchell had accomplished what was expected of him.

For his particular project, Mitchell chose to repair and restore the Hickory Flat Historical Cemetery, including the replacement of approximately 125 permanent headstones and the construction of a memorial plaque for unmarked grave sites.

The National Boy Scout office in Irving, Texas does not track the sort of history made by Jack and Justin Mitchell. According to National spokesman John Dalrymple however, such an occurrence has never before been recorded.

"When you think about a father and son growing up in the same community, and having the same scoutmaster, that's pretty rare," said Richard Smith, Advancement Chairman for Troop 465. "Then, when you consider receiving the honor of Eagle Scout from the same man, it is extremely unusual."

Mitchell plans on furthering his training with the Boy Scouts, hoping to become an assistant scoutmaster.

Figure 6.1A New Eagle Scout Honored




Figure 6.1B New Eagle Scout Honored

#### 6.2. Life Scout



43 Scouts of the troop obtained Life Scout as their highest rank. This represents 6.58%. Considering the number of Eagles who also earned Life there have been approximately 141 Scouts who reached Life.

### 6.3. Star Scout



The troop has had 39 scouts obtain Star Scout as their highest rank. That is 5.97%. If you count the higher ranks which passed through this rank to the higher ranks then there were a total of 179 scouts who obtained the Star Scout rank.

### 6.4. First Class Scout

175 scouts obtained Scout as their highest rank. This is 26.80%. If you count the higher ranks which passed through this rank a total of 532 scouts obtained Scout.




Figure 6.8.A District Court of Honor Held at Nelson, North Georgia Tribune Thursday February 11, 1965 Front Page




Figure 6.8.B. Court of Honor for Thomas Sewell ('94)




Figure 6.8.C. Court of Honor for Thomas Sewell ('94)

## 7.0 Activities

The troop enjoys a variety of activities such as hiking, backpacking, camping, canoeing, rappelling, capture the flag games, orienteering, caving, community service, and many other activities.

## 7.1. Summer Camps

The first two years 1963 and 1964 the troop held its own summer camp at Lake Winfield Scott.

The next six years the troop attended Bert Adams Scout Reservation in Covington, Ga. for summer camp.

In 1971, the troop again held its own summer camp at the Lake Allatoona Council Scout Camp.

In 1972 and 1973 summer camp was held at Cox's Lake on Earney Road.

In 1974 and 1975 the troop held summer camp on the south side of Crowe's Lake, located off Roper road. The site was named Equa-V-Dali (Cherokee for big water) by Eagle Scout and Assistant Scoutmaster **Billy Jarrard** ('68). His mother, **Barbara**, designed a camp patch. It was used for several years until the supply was exhausted and no more were made.

In 1976 Jerry and Susan Crowe invited us to camp on their side of the lake. The troop gladly accepted, and moved. We held summer camp there until 1986. Assistant Scoutmasters, John Ballard, Jerry McClure ('72), Ron Howard and Billy Jarrard ('68) built a 10' X 16' cabin, originally designed as their sleeping quarters, in 1978. We added on to the building three more times: first, increasing the size of the front porch and creating a kitchen; next we added a storage room and increased the kitchen size, adding a sink. The old fishing shack from the south side was given to us by the new owners and we drug it over the dam and erected it on the west side of the cabin for Jr. Staff use. The next big build was a deck on the south side, the length of the original building. A full staircase was added here and the original three steps were removed from the front. Jack Mitchell ('73) designed and built a septic system for the sink.

In 1987, summer camp was held at Bert Adams Scout Reservation.

In 1988 and 1989, the troop returned to Crowe's Lake for summer camp.

In 1990 and 1991 the troop attended the AAC Woodruff Scout Reservation in Blairsville.

In 1992, we returned to Crowe's Lake. A new gable roof was built adding overhead storage and doing away with the shed roofs. In 1993 Equa-V-Dali was renamed **Camp George**, in honor of Scoutmaster **George Lingefelt**. 1993 was our last outing at Crowe's Lake.

Troop summer camps of 2002 and 200, were held at Camp 175, located on Lake Allatoona.

For 2004 through 2007 the troop again attended summer camp at Woodruff Scout Reservation.

In 2008 the troop was granted the use of property, in the Salacoa Valley, near Waleska, Ga., belonging to the **Dr. James Funk** family. The site was promptly named **Camp George** and enjoyed a nine year run there.

In 2017, the troop went out of the area to the Northeast Georgia Council Camp Rainey Mountain, in the northeast Georgia mountains, near Clayton Ga.

In 2018, the troop returned to **Camp George**, in the Salacoa Valley.

For 2019 the troop plans on attending Camp Daniel Boone in Canton, North Carolina.

Some of the years, other troops joined our troop at Equa-V-Dali and the original **Camp George** at Crowes Lake. A scout can earn several merit badges at our own summer camps because of the number of merit badge councilors registered with Troop 465.

# Back from the U.S.S.R.

Local Eagle Scout one of sixteen U.S. scouts to camp with Soviet 'scouts' on shores of the Black Sea

An Eagle Scout from Hickory Flat was one of 16 scouts in the U.S. to participate last month in an exchange program with Scouting's equivalent in the Soviet Union, The Young Pioneers. Adam Smith, 17, recently returned to Cherokee County after

spending nearly a month in the Soviet Union.

The director of the Young Pioneers, which has 75 million coed members, instigated the exchange program because he wants to create a scouting-type alternative to the only youth group in the Soviet Union, said scouting officials.

The trip, which lasted from July 5 through 20, included a 12-hour flight to Moscow, two days of sightseeing and then on to a Young Pioneers camp for six days on the northern shores of the Black Sea.

"It was beautiful, with 2,500-foot mountain ranges all around and coming right down to the water," said Adam.

More than 40,000 boys and girls from the Soviet Union and the United States as well as European countries were divided up into 10 smaller camps of 4,000 to 5,000 each. Split up into four different rooms with only two interpreters among them required the Americans to frequently resort to sign language.

"We communicated pretty well," Adam said of day-to-day communication needs, and with the aid of interpreters, they were able to have more in-depth conversations about the profound changes taking place behind the eroding Iron Curtain.

"They are real impatient. They want all the changes to occur now all at once," the Russians told Adam. "People really want to improve the country."

Adam, who has been in scouting for seven years, was one of 16 boys chosen in May from the 13-county Atlanta area council and the Chicago area council. After the initial application process, which required those interested to submit their back



American and Japanese Scouting begin international friendship program

BSA Chief Scout Executive **Jere B. Ratcliffe** and Japanese Prime Minister **Ryutaro Hashimoto** kicked off a new Boy Scouts of Nippon and Boy Scouts of America Friendship Program at an event in Tokyo in March. The program consists of a series of five two-week visits to Japan by 30 different American Scouts and leaders.

The first group traveled to Japan in March and included Eagle Scouts from each BSA region. In addition to educational tours throughout the country, they joined **Ratcliffe** for the program's opening at "Fuji Scout Day." (Fuji Scouts in Japan are the equivalent of BSA Eagle Scouts.)

In August, Scouts and leaders from BSA councils with active Urban Emphasis programs visited, touring the country and participating in activities at Japan's national jamboree.

Other groups visiting Japan include special-needs Scouts in August 1999, Venturers in August 2000, and a yet-to-be-determined group in 2001.

The Atlanta Area Council is coordinating the Friendship Program. Participating councils are selected, based on prior involvement with international events, by the International Division and each group's corresponding BSA national division.

The program was created in response to a joint message by President **Bill Clinton** and Japanese Prime **Minister Hashimoto** at their 1996 meeting in Tokyo, calling for efforts to promote international understanding.







# Shrine bravery

Many flock to the Georgia National Cemetery dedication

Although the ceremony started out under a sweltering sun, the crowd nonetheless braved the heat Sunday to attend the official dedication of the Georgia National Cemetery.

The 775-acre site in Sutallee was donated by the late Atlanta native and World War II veteran Scott Hudgens and offers visitors multiple scenic views of both the Blue Ridge Mountains and Lake Allatoona.

Phase one of construction covers 110 acres of the site and will include 29,000 gravesites, 3,000 columbaria niches. 765 in-ground garden niches for cremated remains and a garden for scattering

ashës.

Cemetery Director Sandy Beckley said phase one of the site's construction should be complete by the spring of 2007. She said eventually, the \$28 million cemetery will provide a final resting place for more than 38,000 veterans and their family members.

The cemetery already is

The cemetery already is the final resting place for more than 180 veterans, who have been buried since it opened in late April.

The keynote speaker for the afternoon dedica-tion was U.S. Secretary of Veterans Affairs R. James Nicholson. A 30-year Army veteran, Nicholson said the mere presence of those gathered at the dedication proves the significance of the contribution made by those who will come to rest in the cemetery.




Figure 7.4. Troop Presented Colors for President George Bush

## Bands, judges and residents help celebrate completetion of 19-month long project

It took 19 months to complete, cost \$14.9 million and will house 91 full-time employees in its 135,000 square feet. The new Cherokee County Justice Center was dedicated and opened to the public during a ceremony Friday afternoon.

Commissioners John Brandenburg, Dr. Rebecca Ray, Gil Howard and J.J. Biello, along with residents and other elected officials from Cherokee County and the cities that are within its borders, attended the dedication.

"This is a great day for Cherokee County and the City of Canton, said Commission Chairman Brandenburg. "I believe we've come a long ways since we had the ground breaking on Dec. 16, 1992, in a cold rain storm.

"Since January, 1991, this of the Methodist Church locourthouse, if it hasn't domi- cated on the property when it nated all of your commissioner's thoughts and efforts, it has sure taken a big part of them. [The courthouse] was one of the first things we began to consider when we took office in 1991."

Brandenburg recognized the contractor, architects and county employees who were instrumental in the completion of the structure during his brief speech, and explained how the building is being paid for-through the one-cent sales tax option.

When the last penny of sales tax is collected, this building will be paid off," Brandenburg said. "We'll have our debt paid off in about two more years."

He then turned the ceremony over to Boy Scout Troop 465 of Hickory Flat which handled the flag raising ceremony.

Rev. Sanford Willard, pastor

was closed, gave the invocation.

Commissioner Howard made the closing remarks before the open house began.

"No matter how much we, as commissioners, saw the need for this courthouse, no matter how much we wanted to build it, we could not have done it alone, he said. "It was only with the help and support of the people of Cherokee County that this courthouse is here today. If it wasn't for that help, if it wasn't for that trust, if it wasn't for that support, we would be standing here in a vacant parking lot."

Howard said there are eight courtrooms in the building and there are 25,000 square feet allocated for future expansion. Construction started in January 1993 and was completed in August of this year.

## County officially unveils Justice Center to public

CANTON — After more than a year-and-a-half of assembly, the eagerly awaited Justice Center was unveiled Friday and officially presented to residents of Cherokee County at dedication ceremonies for the new government facility.

Mother Nature threatened to steal the county's spotlight — much as it had at the groundbreaking ceremonies for the Justice Center in December 1992 — but threatening clouds soon made way for intense sunshine.

sunshine.

"This is a great day for Cherokee County," said County Commission Chairman John Brandenburg.

"We've come a long way since the cold rainstorm of December 16, 1992."

The 142,000-square-foot Justice Center was paid for by a 1 percent local option sales tax. The facility contains eight courtrooms and officially opened for business Aug. 29 but underwent its coming-out party Friday.

The facility will also house the following former old County Courthouse inhabitants: the Superior Court Clerk's Office, the District Attorney's Office, the Solicitor's Office, the Magistrate's Office, the Probate Court Office, the Probation Office, Pre-trial Services, the County Law Library, the office of State and Juvenile Court Judge C.J. Gober and the offices of Superior Court Judges Frank Mills, Richard Gault and Michael Roach

Judges Frank Mills, Richard Gault and Michael Roach.
"I'm speechless," said Ewald Karasch of Woodstock as he toured the building. "You don't expect something like this for such a small town. I love the woodworking. It's amazing creftmeaship."

woodworking. It's amazing craftmanship."

The Sequoyah High School marching band and the Cherokee High School jazz ensemble entertained the nearly 400 visitors prior to the open house. Boy Scout Troop 465 concluded the ceremonies by raising the state flag, a replica of an 1831 American flag — the year Cherokee County was established —and a present-day American flag which had formerly flown over the Canitol in Washington Do

Capitol in Washington, D.C.

"When I grow old I would like to bring my grandchildren to this grand courthouse and show them what we accomplished," said Western District Commissioner Gil Howard before opening the Justice Center for public inspection. "And by we, I don't mean the commissioners, I mean the people of Cherokee County."

"It's a beautiful new building," said Edith Karasch of Woodstock. "I hope I never have to go to court here, though."

## They'll be Scouting for king

nyone who's slept on the hard ground at Bert Adams Scout Reservation in Covington might not think of it as a place fit for a king.

But King Carl XVI Gustaf of **Sweden** — who was made an honorary Wolf Cub Scout at his baptism at the age of 5 weeks — will visit the local camp Sept. 20 during a trip to Atlanta for the annual meeting of the World Scout Foundation. Royal though he might be, the king is admired for his common touch: He is known, for instance, to be a big fan of singer Stevie Wonder. Boys from six troops in the metro area plan to meet the king and demonstrate their skills for him. "From what I understand, that's the king's favorite part. He likes to talk to the Scouts," said Melanie Vaughn of the Atlanta Area Council of the Boy Scouts.

Carl Gustaf, who became king in 1973 at age 27, serves as honorary president of the foundation, which is working to restore Scouting to the former communist countries of Central Europe and areas that once made up the Soviet Union. During the communist era, a state-controlled organization called the Young Pioneers replaced the Boy Scouts, but those programs have largely been dismantled.

The foundation's meeting is expected to attract about 150 delegates, half of them from 25 other nations. Sweden, incidentally, has about 75,000 Scouts.

Andy Wick earned the Scouter of the Week award at the 1983 Troop Summer Camp. This award is given out each year and the recipient receives an AX.




Figure 8.2 Scouter of the Week Award – Summer Camp 1983






Figure 8.5.A Hans Priegel Memorial Award




Figure 8.5.C Will Morgan receives the first Hans Priegel Memorial Award - 1992




Figure 8.6.F Assistant Scoutmaster John Gollner Silver Beaver Awarded 2014




Figure 8.6.G. George Lingefelt Receives the Liberty Bell Award

Below is a list of lives saved by members of Troop 465.

#### Michael Lingefelt ('67) Two Lives

While attending the Cherokee High School band camp, in Tiger, GA, and being in charge of the waterfront, he rescued 2 boys from their capsized canoe. One of the boys went under with **Michael** several times, but he was successful in saving both boys.

#### Jerry McClure ('72) One Life

When his sister ingested poison tablets, he administered first aid. He induced vomiting, and kept her awake on the way to R. T. Jones Memorial Hospital (now known as Northside-Cherokee Hospital) by holding her head out of the car window. Jerry received no National Council medal, but did receive the Lewis H. Beck Medal for Lifesaving from the Atlanta Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

#### Louie Jones One Life

While with the Troop on the Etowah River, Louie rescued a boy who had jumped from a rope swing into the river without his life vest secured. Louie saved the boy while endangering himself. **Louie** received the Lewis. H. Beck Medal for Lifesaving from the Atlanta Area Council and the Medal of Heroism Award from the National Council.

#### Wesley Wilson One Life

Saved a girl who waded too deep into Lake Allatoona.

#### Gordon Smith One Life

Administered CPR to a suicide attempt at Georgetown Shopping Center near Perimeter Mall in Sandy Springs, Georgia.

#### Wesley Williams ('83) One Life

While in a shopping mall in Atlanta, **Wes** observed a man in a car slumped over the steering wheel. Checking on the man, he realized he was unconscious, and simultaneously gave the man mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and called 911. The man was awake and breathing when the medics arrived.

#### Buckley Wheeler ('03) One Life

When his father severely cut his hand while using a power saw, **Buckley** stopped the bleeding and called 911. He received the Medal of Merit in 2000.





Billy Ballard ('06) One life

Saved his father during a horrendous insulin reaction. He was awarded The Certificate of Merit.



#### Will Absher ('10) Two lives (2010)

Will and his father came home one night to hear screams and splashing in the lake behind their house. Two young adults had capsized their canoe and were flailing helplessly in the icy water. Without hesitation, Will grabbed his canoe and made his way to the lake while his father drove around to the other side. Will rowed out and towed the two people to the opposite shore, where Will and his father helped them get warm while the paramedics were on their way. When the paramedics arrived, they credited Wil with saving the lives of both people, stating if Will arrived even a few minutes later, both victims would have perished. Wil was awarded the Medal of Heroism Award.



Dominick Pellegrino ('09) One Life (2010)

Saved someone from chocking at a Jamboree Troop meeting. **Dominick** was awarded the Medal of Merit.





Nicholas Wagner ('17) One Life (2015)

Administered CPR to a man who suffered a heart attack at a local restaurant. **Nicholas** was awarded the Medal of Merit.





#### Jacob Mavromatidis and Cannon Thompson One Life (2017)

During Summer Camp 2017, these two Scouts showed an exceptional degree of character well above that expected of boys of their age and experience. The actions performed by these two Scouts were instrumental in, possibly, saving another Scout's life and getting the Scout the help that he needed. Because of their thoughtfulness, quick thinking and positive action, they were awarded the <a href="Medal of Merit">Medal of Merit</a>.

### 13. Troop Memories

The patrol members would have to retrieve it, clean it again, then submit it to **John Ballard** for a dreaded re-inspection. The boys enjoyed jumping off the bank into a deep part of the river unfortunately Adam Warner ('92) jumped slightly out of the planned area and hit his knee on an underwater rock creating a minor injury causing the adults to briefly wonder how we would get him to a medical place since it would involve rowing several miles back to the bus but fortunately that was not needed.

**Adam Smith** ('87) was known to carry extra candy bars and snacks on backpacking trips which after arriving at the campsite he could sell them to the other boys at a high price since there were no other stores at the campsite.

Adam Warner ('91) on a non-scouting canoeing tip to Ellijay had borrowed Adam Smith's ('87) canoe which had air bags in it for river canoeing but it had been stored near the wood in his back yard. Adam Warner ('91) secured the canoe upside down on top of his car and was traveling up Interstate 575/GA HWY 515 when he was disturbed by what he thought was a loose rope hitting his window so he rowed down his window and grabbed what he thought was a loose rope but was actually a snake, upon noticing it he quickly threw it out of his car. It landed on the windshield of the GA State Patrol Car following him. Adam pulled over at the next gas station and did the GA State Patrol car who came over to him and said "you scared the \_ \_ \_ out of me". Everyone laughed and went on their way.



### 15.1 Wilderness Survival – 1993 Blizzard of the Century


In March 1993 a few older boys, **Adam Smith** ('87), **Chris Luke** ('95), **Adam Warner** ('92), **Ryan Smith** ('94), and **Matt McCoy** with adult **Richard Smith**, wanted to try some weekend snow camping. They made the hike a personal thing among friends, not as scouting event. The trip occurred during what turned into, and was called, the Blizzard of the Century. They went to Springer Mountain shelter on Friday evening March 12, 1993 and woke up to almost three feet of snow. They remained there until they were picked up by Army Rangers, from Camp Frank D. Merrill, in a Blackhawk helicopter on Thursday March 18, 1993. They were all fine and have many stories to tell about the trip. **Karen Berger**, an author, met them and promised to include them in her book, *An American Pilgrimage, From Georgia to Maine on the Appalachian Trail*, published by Harmony Books, 1-800-733-3000. She remarked they were the best equipped group she had seen. The Atlanta CBS affiliate, Channel 5 WAGA News, carried daily stories from Monday March 15, 1993 to Thursday March 18, 1993 on the young men. The Channel 5 news story was carried on CNN.

The boys and their families were invited back for 5<sup>th</sup> Ranger Training Battalion Open House and Training Demonstration on July 31, 1993.
